Snippets

- Deadhead and prune back flowering shrubs that bloom on current season's wood before the buds break
- Plant pansies and repot geraniums, lantana, Mandeville saved from last year
- Apply dormant spray to fruit trees
- Plant seedlings of cool weather vegetables
- Prune your apple, plum, peach and cherry trees now
- Plant summer-blooming shrubs and vines
